Chantal Mahoney

"Chantal Mahoney is a French-Australian artist.

She has worked in her studio in Headland Park Mosman for more than 10 years.

She had 7 solo exhibitions and has been part of numerous group shows in Australia.

Her paintings explore human beings and performance dancers, clowns, circus world, ceremonial African portraits, Venetian masquerade, and musicians.

Chantal always paints listening to music and the music underlines her work so much that one day a deaf person said to her "when I see your paintings I can hear the music".

Indeed Chantal is also a musician, trained as a classical piano player since she was 7 years old, she recently received as a gift, a piano-accordion that she plays now in the band Sacrebleu.

On the 16th of February, in the Mosman Art Gallery, she is going to give a demonstration about the last project she has been involved, which combines Sound and Colour.

The acclaimed French composer Olivier Messiaen and organist claimed that his complex chords and rhythms came to him in "coloured dreams" in which he saw blue, red and green spirals moving and turning with the sounds. "When I hear music, I see in the mind's eye colours' which move with the music".

In the "Colour Wheel", Jim Moginie's Electric Guitar Orchestra explores the attempts over history to prove the connection between music and colour, or synaesthesia. During the performance 5 electric guitars, bass and percussion play the suite, where each piece attempts to conjure a colour, and meanwhile Chantal Mahoney and Stephen Coburn are adding a colour or spectrum to a large canvas.

Chantal will explain this project that she has already performed 8 times with Jim Moginie's Electric Guitar Orchestra, including in the Sydney Opera House, MONA Hobart, Campbelltown and Manly regional Gallery and Museum...etc,

And she will try to make you experience synaesthesia through her demonstration of painting colours with music."
