Australian and International artist/tutor/judge John Wilson has been painting for 47 years. A leading Oil Painter, he is a multi-award winning artist who has had 49 solo exhibitions and participated in numerous group shows. John has exhibited in London, USA, Japan and Canada. His recent sell out exhibition in Beijina China was highly successful. This year he will be exhibiting in Seoul Korea. John's paintings are in corporate and private collections throughout Australia and internationally. His works have been reproduced extensively, including several feature articles in "Australian Artist" and "International Artist" magazines. He was also included in "Fifty Australian Artists" and the fine art book, "John Wilson Blue Mountains Artist" which chronicles his life and works. Our Last Demonstrating Artist: Jo Lemon

OVERVIEW

Jo works so rapidly that she completed two landscape paintings in 75 minutes. This was achieved with great economy of effort. She aims for a "once through" painting so that the potential of watercolour- its freshness and glow- is achieved. For her, if a painting is not working she abandons it rather than try to fix it and thus create mud. Jo uses reference photographs – maybe more than one for the same landscape, taking elements from one, omitting elements from another, moving elements, all to suit her compositional aim to show the particular story/scene she has in mind.

Watching Jo demonstrate it is clear how little she refers to her reference photo(s) as she works. Working from top of the 300 gsm medium paper towards the bottom she begins with cool colours of light tones (values) and gradually warms up and darkens her tones (values) as she progresses towards the bottom of the paper – through background, middle ground to foreground. Lastly, she paints the foliage of two large foreground trees - placed on one side of the paper only - with rapid calligraphic-like brush strokes laid onto the paper with a mop brush held at a shallow angle. Then a series of randomly varied upward strokes with a rigger brush create branches that loosely connect to the foliage elements. Finally bold upward strokes with a mop brush create the tree trunks.

Jo works mainly wet-in-wet but she does this strategically to get the finished effect she wants. She will use a hair dryer at times to partially dry the paper and then let natural drying continue while she mixes colours for the next washes. Generally she doesn't pre-wet the paper because she wants to control the ratio of pigment to water as she mixes her colours on her palette. That ratio varies from maximum water and minimum pigment (the underpainting and the background) to minimum water and maximum pigment giving a cream-like consistency for the foreground. The wet-in-wet aspect of Jo's work is where she drops in pre-mixed marks with a well-loaded brush onto a still-wet previous wash. Jo also employs dry-brush strokes onto dry paper to get the textural marks she wants.
